

# Our Lady's Guild History

Our Lady's Guild was organized in 1965. The first fundraiser was organized during the construction of St. Mary's School to pay to landscape the front of the new school. The fundraiser was a huge garage sale and was called "The Thieves Market". This sale was continued for ten years. Much more money was raised than needed for landscaping. The new school was supplied with many pieces of equipment, books, and special request items that would not have been provided without the efforts of Our Lady's Guild. St. Mary's School continues to enjoy the support of the Guild.

The original Enchilada Roll was conducted by the St. John's Altar Society of St. Anthony's Church. A small group of women made enchiladas to raise funds to air-condition St. Anthony's Church in the early 1960's.

Our Lady's Guild Enchilada Roll started as a St. Mary's Home and School Association project. They served a Mexican food lunch as a fundraiser and it turned into a sale of our very popular enchiladas. When the sale got too big for St. Mary's Home and School Association, the Guild took it over and it has continued to be a tremendous success.
